Webb is the Chairman of the Board at [Yahoo!](#). He also serves on the board at [salesforce.com](#), [Visa](#) and [Everwise](#). Previously, he was the chairman and CEO of [LiveOps](#), a cloud based call center with a community of 20,000 agents. Prior to LiveOps, he was the COO of [eBay](#), where he created organizational processes and day-to-day structures that enabled eBay to grow from \$140 million in revenue to more than \$6 billion in 2006. Webb has also served on several public and private boards including Gartner (NYSE: IT), Niku (NASDAQ: NIKU), Extensity (NASDAQ: EXTN), Hyperion (NASDAQ: HYSL), Peribit (acquired by Juniper Networks), Baynote, and AdMob (acquired by Google) where he was also one of the first investors.

In 2004, he and his wife created the [Webb Family Foundation](#), which provides underprivileged, motivated young individuals access to quality education and supports individuals who are struggling against the odds to make a positive impact on the world through innovation and hard work.
